Take the next step in your career in disability with this mid-level qualification. CHC43115 Certificate IV in Disability will give you the skills you need to play a lead role in the provision of individualised support and care to people in home, community, or health care settings.

The Certificate IV in Disability - Accelerated Pathway is an intensive program delivered over 6 weeks.

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients' homes, and who promote a person-centred approach, work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

To achieve a CHC43115 - Certificate IV in Disability via the Accelerated Pathway you must have recently completed the Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability) and attend all 4 days of the scheduled face-to-face training.

- CHCDIS009 Follow established person-centred behaviour supports
- CHCDIS010 Facilitate ongoing skills development using a person-centred approach

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability) is a pre-requisite for the Certificate IV in Disability - Accelerated Pathway and assumes recognition of relevant credit transfers.
